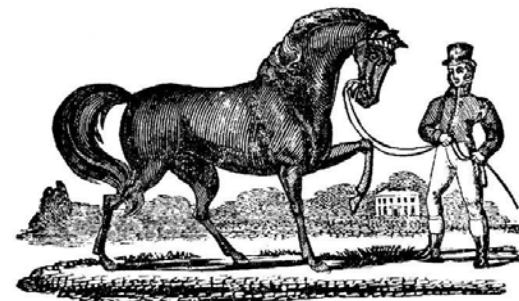

Directions to the Fairfield Hunt Club:

From I-95, take Exit 18, Sherwood Island. Coming from New York, take a left, coming from New Haven, take a right onto the Sherwood Island Connector. Follow the Connector until it ends at the Post Road, approximately one mile. Take a left onto the Post Road and then an immediate right onto Long Lots Road (just after Bertucci's Pizzeria). Go straight for 1 ½ miles. The Hunt Club will be on your right; enter on the driveway alongside the polo field.

FBTA HUNTER TRIALS CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

6 Ribbons to be awarded in each class

Hunter Hack:	To show in the ring at walk, trot, canter & hand gallop. May be asked to back.
Hunt Pairs:	To ride the outside course at a fair hunting pace, changing leaders at halfway point. Coordination of partners to count with respect to size, color, tack, and turnout, and consistent pace and distance between horses.
Hunt Teams:	To ride the outside course at a fair hunting pace, with emphasis on consistency of pace, distance, coordination of team members as to size, color, tack, and turnout. Teams will attempt to jump the last fence abreast. Junior teams must have names!
Barbara Taylor Handy Hunter Classic:	Open to juniors and adults, riding horses or ponies, will show on the outside course performing versatility tests at judges discretion, which may include jumping a fence from a hand gallop, dismounting and mounting, halt and back, etc.
Pleasure Hack:	To show in the ring at walk, trot, & canter. May be asked to back. To be judged on manners and suitability as a pleasure horse or pony for trail riding or hunter pacing.
Family Hunter Hack:	Two or more family members ride together walk, trot.

Adult Champion & Reserve Champion and Junior Champion & Reserve Champion will be awarded for each division

The "Foggy Dew" Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the Adult or Junior Hunter over Fences with the most points

Essentials:

The Hunt Club will be open to the public and serving their Sunday Brunch during the horse trials. Food and beverages will also be available to purchase at the Hunt Club snack bar throughout the day. Water will be available for horses. Dogs on leashes are permitted. An EMT will be on the premises.
